ASU's enrollment highest ever for spring semester

The numbers do not lie. In spite of falling commodity prices, rising unemployment, increasing personal and corporate bankruptcies, and falling stock prices, there is good news for colleges and universities.

More than half of the 35 institutions in the University System of Georgia have seen an increase in their enrollment in the past year. Albany State University has proven to be one of the main beneficiaries with record highs in fall and spring semester enrollment.

Albany State's unofficial number of students enrolled for spring semester 2009 is 4,023. Fall semester 2008 the university recorded the high-

est ever enrollment at 4,176, with 3,814 students enrolled full-time.

"This shows the progress the university is making in terms of doing the right things," said Dr. Joshua Murfree, executive assistant to the president, administrative chief of staff and director of Athletics. "We have advanced enrollment and recruitment to a new level, and that is an excellent mark for this university. We have begun to understand the vision of our president along with the cabinet and concept of being pre-eminent.

"We are working to do what President Obama said when he said, 'One voice can change a room, one room can change a city, one city can

Tucker named to Judicial Advisory Panel

Congressman Sanford Bishop has named Nyota Tucker, legal counsel and pre-law adviser at Albany State University, to serve on an informal panel that will advise the Georgia Democratic Congressional Delegation on presidential appointments to selected judgeships in Georgia.

The panel will be responsible providing recommendations for the appointment of three judges for the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Georgia; one judge for the U.S. District Court for the Middle District of Georgia; one U.S. attorney for all three districts; and one U.S. Marshall for all three districts.

"When Congressman Bishop asked me, I was deeply grateful that he had entrusted me with the

responsibility to be a member of the panel," Tucker said. "As a public servant, I believe that I can serve as the voice of many Georgians who desire federal judicial officers committed to justice and fairness. I look forward to working with the outstanding members of the panel."

A native of Dublin, Ga., Tucker earned a bachelor's degree in political science from Howard University in 1971. She graduated from law school at the

University of Georgia in 1974. After graduation Tucker interned with the NAACP Legal Defense Fund in its San Francisco office. She also practiced law with Georgia Legal Services and in private practice in Albany before joining Albany State University in 1980.

At ASU Tucker has served as the pre-law adviser since 1980. She teaches in the Department of History, Political Science and Public Administration. Since May 2007 Tucker has served as the legal counsel for ASU.

She is the mother of two grown children, Dr. Sadiqa Edmonds-Myles, a physician in New York, and Macharia Edmonds, a law student at Northwestern University in Chicago.

World-renowned guitar duo, soprano to perform at ASU

Two world-renowned musical acts will take the stage at Albany State University.

At 7 p.m. Tuesday, Feb. 24, Duo Spiritoso will perform in the ACAD Auditorium on the ASU campus.

Duo Spiritoso, which consists of guitarists Jeffrey McFadden and Andrew Zohn, was formed in 2004 and is considered to be one of the top new guitar duos in the world. McFadden and Zohn regularly perform together at music festivals in the U.S., Canada and Europe.

Known for their unique programming and spirited performances, Duo Spiritoso often brings to life works by such diverse composers as Rossini, Bartok, Sergio Assad and Celso Machado.

Zohn, has won prizes in five international competitions, including the Guitar Foundation of American and the Stotsenberg International. He has performed as a featured solo artist, orchestral soloist and lecturer in North America and Europe. Zohn is an assistant professor of music at Columbus State University as well as a faculty member of the Guitar on the Mediterranean Festival in Italy and the Guitare Lachine Festival in Canada each summer.

McFadden, a lecturer in guitar at the University of Toronto, had performed throughout North American and Europe. He has recorded seven CDs that have sold tens of thousands of copies. McFadden

regularly performs as a member of Toronto's New Music Concerts Ensembles. He is also a highly regarded clinician and editor of pedagogical materials.

At 7 p.m. Thursday, Feb. 26, renowned soprano Marcia Porter will perform in the ACAD Auditorium on the ASU campus.

Porter made her solo recital debut in Weill Recital Hall at Carnegie Hall in 2005. She has performed in Italy, Brazil, Czech Republic, China and numerous venues throughout the U.S. Some of her recent performances included Haydn's "The Creation," Mendelssohn's "Elijah," Penderecki's "Credo," Mozart's "Requiem" and Rossini's "Stabat Mater."

change a state, one state can change a nation, and undoubtedly one nation can change the world."

In contrast with the fall semester, colleges and universities typically see a decline in students in the spring semester. Even with a slight drop in numbers, Albany State still achieved record enrollment for a spring semester by once again topping the 4,000 mark.

"Much of our success has to do with more concentrated efforts among the various departments involved in registration," said Arna Albritten, dean for Academic Services and Registrar. "There is more effective communication among faculty, staff, students and the administration as a whole. Students have responded well to

the information given to them from the Office of Information and Instructional Technology and in the residence halls."

Albany State uses a number of communication avenues to reach the students. Messages pertaining to registration are disseminated frequently primarily through e-mails, posted signs in campus buildings, text messages and paper mail.

Albritten noted that even though the newer communication techniques have been extremely helpful, it is the academic advisers who play an instrumental role in facilitating the registration process.

Student population has been on the rise for Albany State's spring semesters since 2006 when 3,524 (3,147 full-time) students were enrolled. The next year, popu-

lation rose 8.1 percent to 3,809 (3,444 full-time), and rose another 2.4 percent last year to 3,902 (3563 full-time).

Thomas Harris, director of Financial Aid, said an increase in student enrollment means there is a greater need for students to utilize financial aid opportunities.

"Financial aid has always been in place for students as a supplement for the cost of education," he said. "In today's economy more students are going to need some type of financial aid, so we are here for those who need us. Financial aid remains a resource that more students should take advantage of, which is why we have taken more initiative in reaching out to them through enhanced communication efforts."

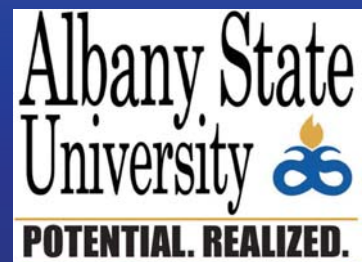

 - c. Special projects involving original ideas.
2. All documents in support of the statement.

Documents to be submitted:

- a. Copies of publications. In case of books, a photocopy of the front cover or page(s) showing the title, author, publisher and year of publication.
- b. Any documentation(s) to verify the development of products, Innovations, patents, authorship and copyrights.
- c. Details about the special project and how it is considered as an original idea and the outcome of the project. For externally funded projects, a copy of the proposal with the approval document from the funding agency.

General guidelines:

- Full-time faculty members employed at ASU for at least three years are eligible for consideration except those who have been honored as the Researcher of the Year during the past five years.
- Please do not list incomplete work in progress, under development, or to be published.
- Please list all activities in reverse chronological order covering the last five-year period only.

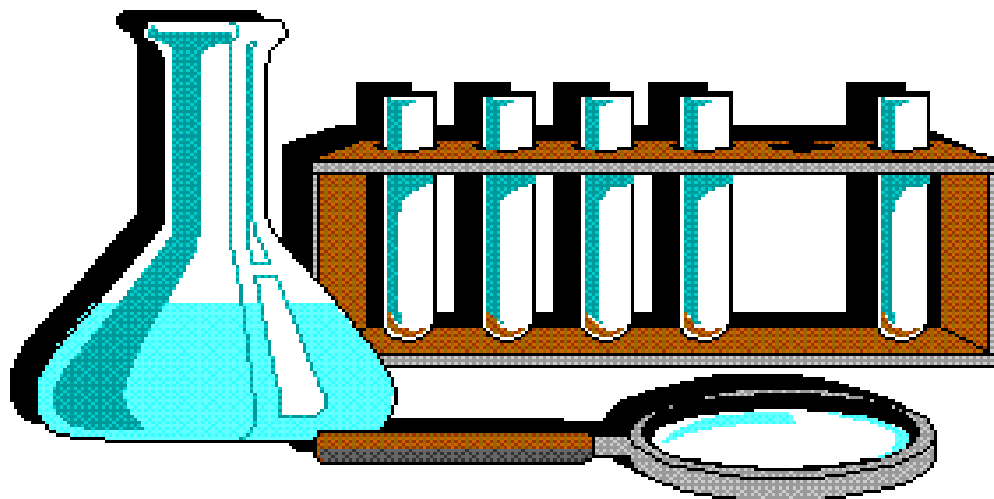

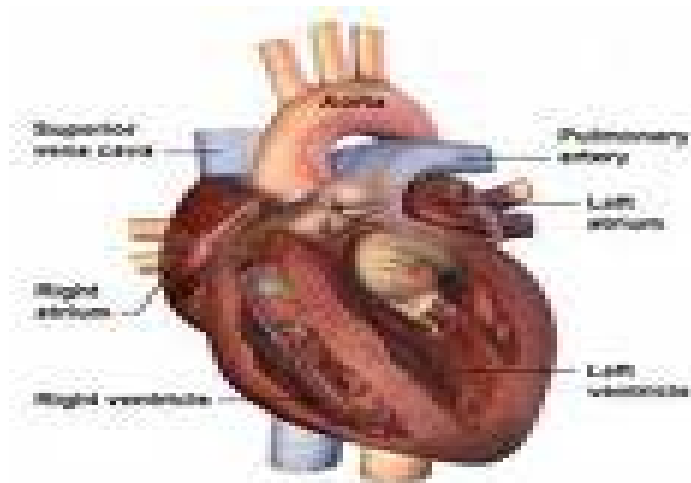

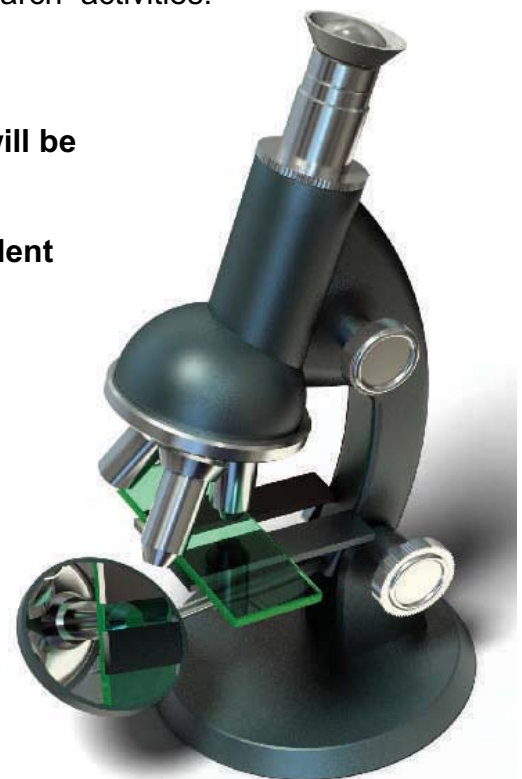
